MSc, PhD, Postdoctoral & Early Career Opportunities in the Population Studies Group at LSHTM

The Population Studies Group at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine has several training, scholarship and job opportunities currently available:

1. MSc Programmes

The Population Studies Group runs two taught postgraduate programmes: the MSc Demography & Health and the MSc Reproductive & Sexual Health Research.

The [MSc Demography & Health](https://www.lshtm.ac.uk/study/masters/demography-health) equips students with the theories and skills to understand and quantify macro-level population dynamics and their downstream implications for health and health policies. Students are further trained in the analysis of micro-level processes that govern population change, including fertility and reproductive behavior, the exposure to health risks, and population mobility. Analysis tools and techniques are applied to high-income settings where data and information are abundant as well as populations that are covered by partial or deficient information systems.

The [MSc Reproductive & Sexual Health Research](https://www.lshtm.ac.uk/study/masters/reproductive-sexual-health-research) is designed for students interested in acquiring the skills necessary to evaluate and critically assess policy-relevant research into sexual and reproductive health.
